



**Gaillardia x 'Arizona Red Shades' Blanket Flower**  
 Deep red flowers cover the compact foliage in early summer. Deadheading blooms will continue all the way through summer and into early fall. Occasionally the flower petals have slightly yellow tips because it is produced from seed. Foliage and flowers stay low at **10-12"**. All America Selections and Fleuroselect Gold Medal winner  
**Plant 15" apart.**

**Gaillardia x grandiflora 'Arizona Sun' Blanket Flower**  
 Arizona Sun is an outstanding new variety, which will produce a profusion of large fiery red and yellow flowers June through August. Its compact mounding habit makes it a wonderful choice for a sunny border planting, growing to **12"**. Attracts butterflies.  
**Plant 15" apart.**

**Gaillardia x grandiflora Mesa™ 'Bright Bicolor' Blanket Flower**  
 Early flowering, a well-branched non-floppy growth habit and extreme drought tolerance make the Mesa™ series a great choice for the full sun perennial border or container. Bright yellow non-fading flowers have a coppery-red center and begin their show on 16-18" tall foliage in early summer and continuing until frost.  
**Plant 18" apart.**

**Gaillardia x grandiflora Mesa™ 'Peach' Blanket Flower**  
 Warm peachy-orange flowers with yellow-tipped petals appear in early summer and the remarkable non-fading flowers continue to bloom until frost. Foliage is dense and non-floppy with a height **16-18"**. A long blooming season and extreme drought tolerance make this a winner in the full sun rock garden.

**Gaillardia x grandiflora Mesa™ 'Yellow' Blanket Flower**  
 Warm, sunny summer days and blanket flower go together, especially with this bright yellow flowering cultivar. **16-18"** tall foliage is compact and non-floppy with early flowering and long lasting, non-fading blooms. Whether in the cut flower garden or border, expect lots of color all season.  
**Plant 18" apart.**

**Galium odoratum Sweet Woodruff**  
 Galium is an herb-like ground cover with whorled shiny-green leaves that hug the ground at about **6"**. It prospers in the shady, moist, well-drained, slightly acidic soil site it loves best. Fragrant tiny white flowers are a bonus in May and June. The foliage is fragrant when dried. Galium works well under shrubs or in a naturalized area.  
**Plant 18" apart.**

**Gaura lindheimeri 'So White'**  
**White Gaura**  
 Bright white flowers appear in wand-like panicles above the green foliage through the summer. Among the most prolific and longest flowering perennials, it will tolerate heat and humidity. Good drainage is essential. Grows **12-18"** tall.  
**Plant 18" apart.**

**Gaura lindheimeri 'Siskiyou Pink'**  
**Pink Gaura**  
 Clusters of nodding small flowers are pink with white tints here and there on arching stems above solid green foliage. Suitable to hot summers, this native Pink Gaura is gorgeous in the border all summer in a natural, informal sort of way. Height at about **30"**. Try Gaura with low-mounding perennials like the Verbenas, Geraniums, or Sedums.  
**Plant 18" apart.**

**Geranium cantabrigiense**  
**'Biokovo'**

**Cranes Bill**

**Perennial Plant of the Year 2015**

This lovely **white**-flowering Geranium with its bit of **pink** border is a sure winner. A valuable ground cover at **12"**, the shiny leaves turn fiery red in the fall and are somewhat evergreen. Expect the flowers in June and July. An added bonus is the spicy fragrance of the foliage throughout the season.

**Geranium cantabrigiense**  
**'Karmina'**

**Cranes Bill**

In late spring this cousin of 'Biokovo' hosts lovely **rose-purple** flowers above fragrant green foliage. An outstanding ground cover, the foliage spreads quickly and uniformly and shows off a beautiful reddish-orange color in fall. 'Karmina' reaches **10-12"** in height and prefers average to moist well-drained soil. **Plant 18"** apart.

**Geranium macrorrhizum**  
**'Bevan's Variety'**

**Bigroot Geranium**

Spreading by rhizomes, this species forms a dense ground cover that chokes out weeds. **Magenta** blooms in mid to late spring can be cut back hard when finished just to leaf out and bloom again. Fragrant foliage turns an attractive red/bronze hue in the fall, giving three seasons of interest. Tolerates heat and humidity better than most other geranium species. Grows **8-12"** tall. **Plant 18"** apart.

**Geranium lancastriense**  
**Cranes Bill**

Creeping and carpet-like at **6"**, lancastriense blooms most heavily in June and July, but its little **salmon-pink** flowers with a crimson vein will appear into late summer. **Plant 18"** apart.

**Geranium macrorrhizum**  
**'Ingwersen's Variety'**

**Bigroot Geranium**

Small **light pink** flowers appear in clusters above the aromatic semi-evergreen leaves from the end of May through June on this weed-smothering ground cover. We like the bright bronze and scarlet of the leaves in fall and the compact carpeting effect at **12"** in height. **Plant 18"** apart.

**Geranium macrorrhizum**  
**'Spessart'**

'Spessart' offers the same great ground cover attributes as 'Bevan's Variety' and 'Ingwersen's Variety' but with flowers that are almost **white** with a very **slight pink blush**. Pink buds open to whitish blooms in summer and are held above the **12-15"** tall fragrant foliage. Deeply lobed leaves turn bronze-red in fall. **Plant 12"** apart.

**Geranium sanguineum**  
**Bloody Cranets Bill**

Glowing flowers of **reddish-purple** from June into August will take your breath away. Then in the fall, the dark green leaves which look like asterisks, turn a bright red—thus the nickname Bloody Cranets Bill. At about **6"** in height, it will benefit from a bit of shade in the hottest months of our Maryland summer. **Plant 18"** apart.

**Geranium sanguineum 'Album'**

**Bloody Cranes Bill**

'Album' has clear **white flowers** at **10-18"**. Notoriously tolerant of heat and cold, the sanguineums will flower well if provided partial sun (or even full sun if irrigation is possible during droughty summer times), but good drainage is essential. Blooming for 6-8 weeks, it will combine well with many other perennials and brighten garden designs from June through July.

**Geranium sanguineum 'Max Frei'**

**Cranes Bill**

Popular for its compact, fast-growing, attractive foliage and profusion of dependable **deep magenta** flowers from June into August. What a hardy groundcover at **6-10"**.

**Geranium x oxonianum 'Wargrave Pink'**

**Cranes Bill**

This vigorous hardy Geranium with its **pink flowers** grows well in open woodlands or in roomy mixed borders where it can weave and climb among other plants. Through June and July it will delight you as it hangs over walls, looks great in containers, or covers spent bulb foliage at a height of **12-15"**. Try it with Artemisia or the variegated foliage Phalaris for a bright look.

**Geranium x 'Rozanne'**

**Cranes Bill**

**Perennial Plant of the Year 2008**  
Now considered one of the longest-blooming Geraniums introduced, expect large 2" **violet-blue** flowers with a tiny white center from June to frost. It grows about **20"** tall and **24"** wide. If Geraniums are your passion the heat tolerance of 'Rozanne' makes her irresistible. Expect a red fall foliage display after a summer of deep green slightly marbled leaf color. PP#12175

**Geum 'Fire Storm'**

**Avens**

'Fire Storm' blooms boldly and profusely in the spring landscape with **apricot-orange** semi-double blooms on **12-20"** tall wiry stems. Vigorous and compact in habit with improved flowering over older varieties. Prefers moist soil and some afternoon shade in hot summer climates. Use in the front of the border. PP# 23179

**Plant 24"** apart.

**Gypsophila repens 'Alba'**

**Creeping Baby's Breath**

Adorable petite **white** flowers bloom in profusion covering the grey-green foliage from early to mid-summer. Trimming back immediately after the first flowering will encourage re-blooming. At **4-6"** tall, the creeping foliage will drape over rock walls or spill out of containers. Well drained light soil is essential for winter survival and plant is drought tolerant once established. **Plant 12"** apart.




**Hedera helix English Ivy**

Lush as a groundcover, it will choke out weeds and provide glossy deep green cover year round. Foliage will grow to a height of **12"**. Vigorous as a climber of walls or other upright structures, it can eventually reach up to 100'. 2" to 4" leaves are dark green with white veins. Juvenile leaves have 3 to 5 lobes whereas adult leaves are diamond-shaped. Prefers loamy soil and average moisture. Provide partial shade and protection from winter damaging winds. Due to its aggressive nature, take care to avoid planting near unmanaged woodlands or other sensitive areas.

Plant **6-12"** apart.

**Hedera helix**  
**'Baltica'**  
**Baltic Ivy**  
The dark green evergreen leaves have distinctive white veins and are slightly smaller than *H. helix*, climbing rapidly up to 40' or to a height of **8-12"** as a ground cover.  
**Plant 6-12" apart.**

**Hedera helix**  
**'Anne Marie'**  
**Variegated Ivy**  
The 1.5"-2.5" leaves are multiple shades of green with white margins. 'Anne Marie' reaches **12"** in height as a ground cover or up to 40' as a climbing vine.  
**Plant 6-12" apart.**

**Hedera helix**  
**'Needlepoint'**  
**Needlepoint Ivy**  
Small (1.5"-2") delicate leaves with sharply pointed lobes and an elongated central lobe. Moderate growth rate.  
**Height: 6-12"**

**Helenium autumnale**  
**Mariachi™ 'Fuego'**  
**Helen's Flower, Sneezeweed**  
Masses of blooms with **gold and orange** petals that surround large brown cones supply seemingly endless cut flowers and sizzling hot color in mid to late summer. Compact, well-branched foliage grows to **18-20"**. Prefers average, well-drained soil. Bred by Arie Blom of the Netherlands. PPAF  
**Plant 24" apart.**

**Helenium autumnale**  
**Mariachi™ 'Salsa'**  
**Helen's Flower, Sneezeweed**  
Spice up the sunny border from June to September with **tomato-red** flowers that top **18-20"** tall foliage. Red petals surround a dark brown cone and make *fantástico* cut flowers. Trim in early June to promote branching and a larger display of blooms. Prefers moist, well-drained soil. PPAF  
**Plant 24" apart.**

**Helenium autumnale**  
**Mariachi™ 'Sombrero'**  
**Helen's Flower, Sneezeweed**  
A bright **yellow** partner to 'Fuego' and 'Salsa' with the same terrific branching habit that means loads of blooms covering dark green foliage in mid summer to fall. Lemon yellow petals surround a prominent yellow cone. Grows **18-20"** tall. PPAF  
**Plant 24" apart.**

**Helianthus angustifolius**  
**'First Light'**  
**Willow Leaf Sunflower**  
Blooms **golden yellow with dark brown eyes** in mid fall. It is a self-supporting plant with narrow elongated foliage growing about 4' tall, which makes it great for back of the bed planting. Try leaving the stalks and seed heads up in the winter for interest and the birds.

**Helianthus**  
**'Lemon Queen'**  
**Lemon Queen Sunflower**  
This tall and stately perennial sunflower will reach **5-8'** high and flowers July-September. Single layered **lemon yellow** flowers are 2" across, offering masses of simple daisies. It is drought tolerant and low maintenance for naturalistic gardens.  
**Plant 24" apart.**

**Heliopsis helianthoides**  
**'Summer Sun'**  
**False Sunflower**  
This native provides a never-ending supply of golden-yellow semi-double long-stemmed daisies that resemble small sunflowers, above glossy deep green foliage. Great for cutting and definitely attracts butterflies. We have chosen it for its more compact growth habit at **3-4'** than other Heliopsis.  
**Plant 18" apart.**

**Helleborus orientalis**

**'Brandywine'**

**Lenten Rose**

This is a wonderful introduction from long time hellebore breeder, David Culp. The flower colors will vary from **white, yellow, pink, burgundy and purple to nearly black** on single, semi-double and double blooms. It blooms in early spring with nice evergreen foliage and grows to **18"** in height.

**Helleborus orientalis 'Lady Series'**

Many gardeners have found success with the Helleborus Lady Series. They have rich colors with round and mostly upright flowers on tidy plants. Perfect for naturalizing in moist, woodland areas. Lustrous dark green foliage growing **14-18"** tall. Flowering in late winter - early spring. **Plant 18"** apart. **Zones 4 - 8**



**Helleborus x 'Anna's Red'**

**Lenten Rose**

Like older sis 'Penny's Pink', the new foliage emerges bronze-green with hot pink veins but 'Anna's Red' differs with her deep purple buds and **reddish-purple** flowers that are held on dark red stems in late winter. Leaves age to dark green with cream marbling and blooms continue profusely into spring. Grows **18-24"** tall and wide. PPAF

**Helleborus x ballardiae**

**'Merlin'**

**Helleborus Gold Collection®**  
**Lenten Rose**  
In late winter enchanting **powdery-pink** outward facing blooms appear and cast a spell on the unsuspecting. Flowers age to reddish-rose pink and last for weeks in the spring garden. Attractive evergreen dark green leathery foliage and maroon stems reach **12-15"** tall. PP#22350 **Plant 24"** apart.

**Helleborus x ballardiae**

**'Pink Frost'**

**Helleborus Gold Collection®**  
**Lenten Rose**  
Welcome sights in February after a long cold winter are the burgundy buds and **dusty pink** to whitish blooms that mature to a rosy red and continue to bloom into April. Imagine the deep green silvery brushed foliage and the burgundy stems and buds emerging **12-15"** above a snow dusted garden. Spring is around the corner! PPAF

**'Monte Cristo'**

**Helleborus Gold Collection®**  
**Lenten Rose**  
What a beautiful sight to see when Lenten Rose emerges from the ground in late winter, often through a dusting of snow. Rose-pink buds on dark red stems open to outward-facing **creamy white** flowers that have a **peachy rose blush**. Blooms continue into spring above blue-gray foliage. A profuse bloomer that grows **12-15"** tall. PPAF **Plant 18"** apart.

**Helleborus x ericsmithii**

**'Shooting Star'**

**Helleborus Gold Collection®**  
**Lenten Rose**  
One of the heaviest bloomers of the collection, star gazers will be in awe of the **creamy white** blooms with a **light pink** reverse that begin to appear in January and continue for many weeks. Blooms are held on red stems and fade to light green with yellow centers. **18"-22"** tall. PP#22424 **Plant 18"** apart.

**'Ice Breaker Corsica'**

**Helleborus Gold Collection®**  
**Lenten Rose**  
**White** flowers with a slight green tinge age to dusky green and are held on strong stems above gray-green foliage in winter to early spring. Grows **12-18"** tall. PPAF **Plant 18"** apart.

**Helleborus x 'Ivory Prince' Lenten Rose**  
 This hybrid has attractive blue green, evergreen foliage. **12-18"** in height. Blooms late winter to early spring with pink flushed buds that open up to ivory blooms streaked with rose and chartreuse. PP#16199. **Plant 18"** apart.

**Helleborus x 'Penny's Pink®' Lenten Rose**  
 Penny blooms a delightful **mauve pink** from late winter to mid-spring, but that's not all! The spring foliage starts out bronze-green with deep pink veins and purple stems and is especially nice against the early purple flower buds. As the season progresses the veins become bright green, complimenting the long-lasting pink flowers. **18-24"** tall. PPAF **Plant 24"** apart.

**Helleborus x 'Royal Heritage' Lenten Rose**  
 This hybrid blooms six weeks or more starting in late winter with saucer shaped flowers that range from **reds to maroons, yellows and pale greens** often lightly mottled with maroon. The evergreen foliage has a leathery texture growing **18-24"**. Lenten Rose prefers moist, but well drained soil with plenty organic matter. Try planting it with Ajuga 'Catlin's Giant' and Hosta 'Francee'. **Plant 15"** apart.

**Helleborus x sahinii 'Winterbells' Lenten Rose**  
 In very early winter bells begin to appear nodding from narrow stems, **pale green** on the inside and **creamy pink** on the reverse. Blooms continue for months above the dark green evergreen foliage that grows **12-15"** tall. 'Winterbells' is the first ever successful cross between Helleborus niger (Christmas Rose) and Helleborus foetidus (Stinking Hellebore). **Plant 24"** apart.

**Helleborus x hybridus Winter Jewels™ Series**

This phenomenal collection of singles and doubles in remarkable colors with large 3-4" in diameter flowers, all profuse bloomers, have been hand-bred by one of the world's best Hellebores hybridizers, Marietta O'Byrne. **Height: 18-24"**. **Plant 18"** apart.

**'Apricot Blush'**  
 Peachy yellow to apricot flowers with rose-pink veins and picotee edge.



**'Cherry Blossom'**  
 Downward facing blooms have cherry red edges and veins with a red starburst center.



**'Golden Sunrise'**  
 Shades of yellow single flowers are sometimes solid or may have red veins or picotee edges.



**'Jade Star'**  
 Single green flowers have burgundy veins and leaf centers.



**'Ruby Wine'**  
 Red and burgundy single flowers are cup-shaped with contrasting white stamens.



**'White Pearl'**  
 Single white flowers have burgundy-red centers and occasionally are double flowers.





Give this specimen plant some room and part shade. It will grow to 4' or so with its long spikes of deep **yellow** flowers in late June. It has lots of large green triangular leaves with coarse jagged edges and stiff flower stems. Very effective near a stream or at the edge of a woodland. **Plant 18" apart.**

**Lily Looks™ Dwarf Asiatic Hardy Lilies**

Bursting with color in mid-summer, these compact Lilies are offered in many bold and beautiful colors with very high bud counts and are perfect for the front of the border, rock garden, containers, or using as cut flowers. Provide good drainage.

**'Casa Blanca'**

**Oriental Hardy Lily**

A fragrant, **pure white** Oriental Hardy Lily that blooms in July to 48". It is considered by many experts to be the finest of its kind. Oriental Hardy Lilies are taller than the Asiatic, most having a striking fragrance, and they bloom later in the season.

**Plant 18" apart.**

**Oriental Hardy Lily**

Sweet ruffled **pink** flowers are lightly speckled near the center and bloom in mid-summer with 4-5 large flowers per stem. Enjoy the fragrance and beauty by planting in mass near the front or middle of the border or use in mixed containers. Grows **18-24"** in moist, well-drained soil.

**Oriental Hardy Lily**

The **brilliant crimson** of this fragrant Oriental Hardy Lily is speckled and edged with **pure white**. It is shorter than most Orientals at **28"** and blooms in July. Would be outstanding in containers, borders, or a vase.

**Oriental Hardy Lily**

Wonderful fragrance and large eye-catching flowers will draw more than just hummingbirds! Speckled burgundy-red blooms have a thin white margin on the slightly scalloped petals. The dark green foliage grows **16-18"** tall and has 5-7 flowers per stem.

**'Grace Ward'**

**Grace Ward Lithodora**

There are few flowering plants that have such a contrast of **bright blue flowers** and deep green foliage reaching **4-6"**. It has nice texture and spreading mat form. It flowers in the spring with some reblooming in the fall. Grows best in full sun and well-drained soil, trim back after blooming. Considered a tender perennial in our area, it is a drought tolerant plant worth having in any sunny garden spot.

**Plant 12" apart.**

**Lobelia cardinalis**

**Red Cardinal Flower**

**Brilliant red** spikes up to **36"** rise above the bronzy light green foliage on this native perennial that is happy in a moist, part-shady spot, or in the sun. You will see its flowers from August into September along a woodland path or by the edge of a pond, and if you wait a minute you may see how much hummingbirds enjoy it as well.

**Plant 18" apart.**

**Lobelia cardinalis**

**'Black Truffle'**

**Cardinal Flower**

Emerging spring foliage is nearly black, transforming to deep maroon in summer and holding this color throughout the growing season. Brilliant **red** flowers bloom on **3-4'** stems in August and September. Perfect water-side attraction for hummingbirds and butterflies. PPAF

**Plant 18" apart.**

**Lobelia siphilitica**

**Blue Cardinal Flower**

A bit more sun-tolerant than the Red Lobelia, the **blue spikes** of this native flower in August and September with the same upright growth habit and a bushier shape. Growing **3-4'** tall. The blue Lobelia likes a moist to average growing situation.

**Plant 18" apart.**

### Lychnis 'Lipstick'

#### Maltese Cross

Bursting with color from early to late summer, **reddish-orange** flowers really pop next to the **36-48"** tall purplish-bronze foliage. This Russian native is a short-lived perennial and freely self-seeds. Prefers average, well-drained soil. Drought tolerant once established.

**Plant 24"** apart.

### Lysimachia nummularia

#### Creeping Jenny

This little ground hugger (**3-4"**) is always sought after and enjoyed by gardeners despite its aggressiveness. The species has small round green leaves with root nodes between that account for Creeping Jenny's ability to fill in around steps, rocks, or pathways. Equally gracious spilling over a container or window box, it has fragrant little **yellow** flowers in May.

**Plant 18"** apart.

### Lysimachia nummularia

#### 'Aurea'

#### Golden Creeping Jenny

Sharon Branson, key nursery staffer, likens gold-leaved 'Aurea' to a "shower of golden coins" covering the ground at **3-4"** where this best selection of Creeping Jenny brightens the rock garden or pathway between stepping stones. No matter that the **yellow flowers** in May are lost in the bright foliage. Try it as an underpinning to Geranium 'Rozanne' or the rich dark blue of Veronica 'Royal Candles' spikes. **Plant 18"** apart.

### Mazus reptans

#### Creeping Blue Mazus

Same fast-spreading, tight, **1"** carpet of little green leaves as our white Mazus, with **blue flowers** appearing in May-June close to the foliage. Handling some foot traffic, it is the perfect choice between stones on a path, or as a carpet under rose bushes.

**Plant 18"** apart.

### Mazus reptans 'Albus'

#### Creeping White Mazus

Literally a carpet of bright green small leaves that spread rapidly in full sun to make a thick mat at about **1"**. Moisture-tolerant, tough and hardy, Mazus sports **white flowers** in May and June just above the foliage. It works well in the rock garden, as an underpinning to roses, or between stepping-stones or pavers along a pathway. This is a strong grower and can't be beat as a ground cover alternative.

**Plant 18"** apart.

### Meehania cordata

#### Creeping Mint

A native of rich woodlands in the mountains of Pennsylvania south to North Carolina and west to Ohio and Tennessee, this lovely little mint at **3-6"** spreads by runners covering the woodland floor. Adorned with masses of **1"** **violet-blue** flowers in May and June, try interlacing between native Bleeding hearts and Christmas fern. Provide moist organic soil in dappled shade.

**Plant 12"** apart.

### Mentha requienii

#### Corsican Mint

From the Mediterranean comes this micro-sized mint at **2"** with tiny rounded leaves and **lavender** flowers in summer. Forming a dense carpet, a fresh and cleansing aroma is released with each step when planted in and around a stone path. Use as a covering for small areas, in containers or in the vegetable bed to repel garden pests. Some shade and well drained soil are essential.

**Plant 8"** apart.

### Mertensia virginica

#### Virginia Blue Bells

The tubular flowers of our native Virginia Blue Bells are **sapphire blue in color with hints of pink** on **2"** stems among rich green foliage. After blooming in April and May in the moist light shade it loves, the plant goes completely dormant, so plant them among Ferns and Hostas.

**Plant 18"** apart.
